Finally, we had to sadly bid farewell to a great World War II hero and veteran of four combat parachute jumps, Dan Georgevich, who

passed away on June 6th. Dan passed away on the 68th anniversary of his first combat jump into Normandy in the early hours of the Allied invasion.


I encourage you to mark your calendars for the following upcoming events and look forward to your participation:

The 2012 AUSA Annual Meeting and Exposition is Almost Here

The 2012 AUSA Annual Meeting and Exposition will take place 22-24 October at the Walter E. Washington Convention Center in Washington, D.C.

Since 1950, the Association of the United States Army (AUSA) has worked to support all aspects of national security while advancing the interests of America's Army and the men and women who serve.

AUSA is a private, non-profit educational organization that supports America's Army - Active, National Guard, Reserve, Civilians, Retirees, Government Civilians, Wounded Warriors, Veterans, and family members. AUSA provides numerous Professional Development Opportunities at a variety of events both local and national.

Held every October in Washington D.C., the AUSA Annual Meeting & Exposition is one of the largest land warfare exhibitions and professional development forums in the world.

The Annual Meeting consists of informative presentations, panel discussions on pertinent military and national security subjects, workshops and important AUSA business meetings. The three day event also includes over 700 industry and military exhibits occupying over 700,000 square feet of exhibit space. Presentations on the state of the Army and related defense subjects are given by the Secretary of the Army, the Army Chief of Staff and other senior Army and Department of Defense (DoD) representatives.

The event provides a unique opportunity to showcase defense industry products and services to key Army and DoD decision-makers, discover new developments in defense technology and meet with colleagues from the world-wide defense community.

Wounded Warrior Weekend at DD Gamble Guest Ranch

The three Arizona Chapters of the Association of the United States Army (AUSA) organized a 14-16 September all expense paid week-end getaway at the Davidson's Dream (DD) Gamble Guest Lodge and Hideout Ranch near Portal, AZ for four Wounded Warriors. The open-country ranch, consisting of 325 acres of desert lands, is nestled between the picturesque Chiricahua and Peloncillo mountains of southern Arizona near the New Mexico state line. The Portal area is renowned for its frontier style of living.

Our guest Warriors were treated to plenty of good food provided by lodge owners Tom and Alicia Davidson, horseback riding, miniature horse drawn carriage rides, exploring the canyons and mountains, as well as, star and sun gazing with specialized telescopes provided by a local astronomer. Three of the Warriors came from the Warrior Transition Unit (WTU) at Fort Huachuca and one came from "Heroes to Hometowns", a Phoenix based Wounded Warrior resource center. The Advocate for the latter is Kathy Pearce. All of the Wounded Warriors were veterans of the global war on terrorism.

Funding was provided by the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services and generous donations from our Chapter members. This event was so well received, that our AZ AUSA Chapters are considering future iterations of the week-end. We hope that the Wounded Warriors know how much we appreciate their sacrifices!

Junior ROTC Armed Forces Career Officers Day (AFCOD)



On 20 November 2012 our Territorial Chapter will hold the 24th Armed Forces Career Officers Day (AFCOD) at the McCormick Ranch Golf Club.
